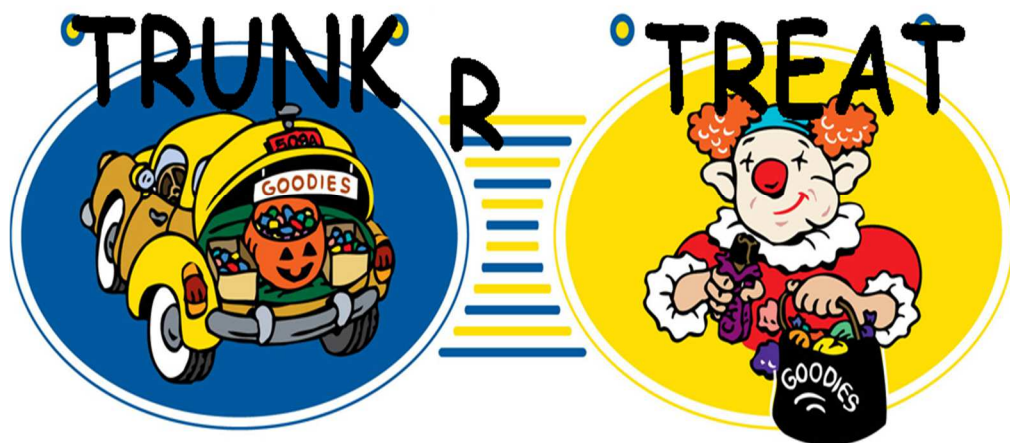

## FROM MY HEART TO YOURS:



### Reading the Psalms

During these continuing days of semi-isolation and social distancing, let me suggest a Bible reading devotional plan for October. Try reading the Psalms, five each day. There are 150 Psalms and 31 days in October. So, you can have a bonus or catch-up day. Since Psalm 119 is by far the longest of the Psalms, you may wish to spend one day on it.

The Book of Psalms is the most often quoted Old Testament book in the New Testament. Isaiah ranks right up there with it. Jesus knew and loved the Psalms. The other writings of the New Testament are saturated with the Psalms. The Apostle Paul stated that the early church sang psalms in their worship (Ephesians 5:19). Many of the Psalms have been put to music by modern composers.

We often think of David as the author of the Psalms. But other writers include Moses, Solomon, Asaph, and the sons of Korah. Some of the Psalms have unknown authors.

The Psalms may be categorized into various types, based on content and emphasis. Some Psalms seem to fit into more than one category. Note the following:

**Lament**—emotional cries and pleas to God for deliverance from difficult situations. Ps. 3-5; 7; 12-13; 17; 22; 25-27; 35; 39-44; 54-60; 62; 64; 69-71; 74; 77; 79-80; 83; 85-86; 88; 90; 94; 120; 123; 126; 134; 137; 140-142; 144.

**Thanksgiving**—expressions of gratitude to God for His manifold blessings. Ps. 9-11; 16; 23; 30-31; 34; 48; 62; 66-68; 75; 91-92; 106-109; 115-116; 118; 121; 124-125; 129; 131; 138-139.

**Hymn or Praise**—declarations about the greatness of God. Ps. 8; 15; 19; 24; 29; 33; 46; 52; 65; 81-82; 87; 100; 103-105; 111; 113-114; 117; 122; 135-136; 145-150.

**Royal**—prayers for God's blessings on Israel's king; some with messianic implications and fulfillments. Ps. 2; 18; 20-21; 45; 50; 61; 63; 72; 84; 89; 101; 110; 132.

**Providence**—celebration of God's rule over all His creation. Ps. 47; 93-99.

**Penitential**—expressions of contrition and repentance. Ps. 6; 28; 32; 38; 51; 102; 130; 143.

**Wisdom/Didactic**—practical guidance for godly living. Ps. 1; 14; 36-37; 49; 53; 73; 76; 78; 112; 119; 127-128; 133.

May the Lord bless your reading of and meditation on the Psalms.
