### From my heart to yours:

#### Power in the Cross

Archaeologists have discovered a drawing and inscription in what was

evidently a room beneath the imperial palace in Rome. Apparently the drawing was intended to be a caricature of the crucifixion of Jesus. It depicts a man's body hanging on a cross, but the head is that of a donkey.

To the left of the cross is the figure of a young man with his hand raised as if he is worshiping the figure on the cross. The sarcastic inscription below the drawing reads, "Alexamenos worships his god."

The room where the drawing was found very likely was used as a prison. With a little imagination, we can construct the situation. A young man named Alexamenos was a Christian. Perhaps he was a servant in the imperial palace or more likely, a prisoner. This much is clear: Alexamenos was being mocked by those who were not in sympathy with his worship of Jesus Christ.

This drawing is a vivid illustration of Paul's comment on the cross, "For the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us who are saved it is the power of God" (1 Corinthians 1:18). Paul added that the cross was a stumbling block to the Jews who expected a military messiah. To the enlightened Greeks it was sheer foolishness. Despite these obstacles, Paul concluded that wherever the word of the cross is proclaimed, God's life changing power is released.

The cross may still be regarded as a stumbling block to some. For those who have the eyes of faith, however, the cross means life can be different. Elsewhere Paul writes, "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature; old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new" (2 Corinthians 5:17). The old rugged cross has made the difference! We can experience a new life in Christ. Fear, guilt, and despair are replaced with courage, peace, and hope. No wonder Paul could exclaim, "But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world" (Galatians 6:14). Yes, there is nowen in

world" (Galatians 6:14). Yes, there is power in the cross!
