From my heart to yours:

Several years ago Jackie and I had a marvelous time studying at the University of Durham in England.



The focus of the summer workshop was early Celtic Christianity in Great Britain. Afterward we stopped at a little village called Castle Camps, a few miles from Cambridge. The village has some attractive thatched-roof homes and is surrounded by wheat fields.

Castle Camps had meant nothing to me until a few months prior to our trip. I ran across another Stubblefield on the internet. This Stubblefield had more information about our common roots than I had discovered. He had traced our family tree beyond Gloucester County, Virginia in 1675 to Castle Camps. There twelve generations ago in 1570, William Stubblefield was born. His grandson Simon was the first Stubblefield on American soil.

Our search for Stubblefield roots at Castle Camps was not fruitful. However, at the village church we picked up a brief history of the church going back to Saxon times. The clergy are known since 1337. One of these was John Ernest Bode who served from 1860 to 1874 and is buried in the adjacent cemetery. He is known in the larger Christian world as the author of the hymn, "O Jesus, I Have Promised." Bode wrote the hymn at a particularly difficult time of personal struggle. There were problems in the church as well. Recall some lines of the hymn:

O Jesus I have promised to serve
Thee to the end;

Be Thou forever near me,
my Master and my friend;

I shall not fear the battle,
if Thou art by my side,

Nor wander from the pathway,
if Thou wilt be my guide.

These words still offer encouragement and hope for all of us when we face tough times. As Moses wrote long ago, "The eternal God is thy (our) refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms" (Deuteronomy 33:27).

As we turn the calendar on June, Vacation Bible School is just around the corner. Note the information on the front of the Banner. We look forward to a large number of boys and girls in attendance. We are grateful for Shelly Wagner and her leadership in putting together this year's VBS. A special thanks to all the workers who will be involved in helping touch the lives of the wonderful kids entrusted to our care.

Two other major events will take place during June. Our Wyoming Mission Trip is scheduled for June 21-July 1. Willard Zeiser is leading this important mission effort. The names of the others making the trip are found elsewhere in the Banner. Let's remember to pray for their safe travel and that the Lord will use them in a powerful way at WindCity Church in Casper.

During the last week of June, our children will go to camp. Each year boys and girls make decisions for Christ at this spiritual retreat.

Push the buzzer  to the right of the door.

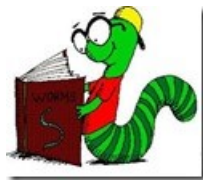
Wait for a response. The **red** light will turn **green** when the door is unlocked.

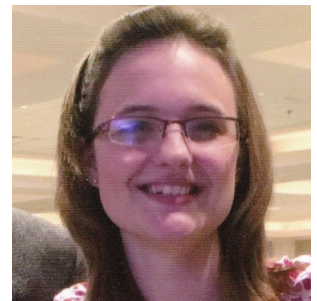
