The speaker at the next meeting of the Men's Fellowship in the Fellowship Hall will be our own Robert Maynard.

Robert began his career as a police officer with the Fort Worth, Texas, police force. Over the next forty years Robert spent time in several divisions of the force, including Patrol Officer with the Radio Patrol Division, working radar, investigating car and motorcycle accidents, patrolling the freeways, and investigating fatalities. In 1979, Robert was assigned to the Traffic Division as a Hit and Run Investigator. Due to his outstanding ability as a fatality investigator, Robert was able to attend numerous Accident and Fatality training courses. These included Advanced Accident Investigation and the investigations involving 18 wheelers, pedestrians, pedal cyclists, buses, trains, reconstruction, and motorcycle accidents. Robert investigated accidents involving over 500 fatalities.

While working one accident with Fort Worth Police Force, Robert was struck by a hit and run driver that resulted in his spending 47 days in the hospital and in a cast from the waist down two and a half years. After leaving the police force, Robert was a Principal Investigator for the Progressive Insurance Company. Currently, he serves as an investigator for Justin Minton, Attorney.

Robert and his beloved wife, Dottie (deceased in 2017), moved to the Village in 1999. Robert joined BRBC in 2017 and is a member of the New Horizons Sunday School Class.
